1. RESEARCH STATEMENT

The focus of my research program is to achieve optimal participation in everyday life for adults and older adults with executive function (EF) (high-level cognitive) impairments. Since beginning my tenure stream appointment July 1, 2012 (tenure granted July 1, 2015), my grants have totaled more than 10 million dollars, I have had 50 papers published or accepted for publication and have been primary supervisor for 28 graduate trainees and post-doctoral fellows. My complete research statement elaborates on my current research program's main thematic areas: rehabilitation for people with executive function impairments and ecologically valid assessment for cognitive impairments.

2. TEACHING PHILOSOPHY

My teaching and educational activities are based on my belief that learning is a life-long, interactive and transformative process and that our pedagogical methods while being flexible and student-centred must develop critical thinking in our students. I fully ascribe to the philosophy and values articulated in our Department's Educational Conceptual Framework (ECF, Dawson et al., 2012) and in my own teaching pay particular attention to cognitive neuroscience theories (Clark & Clark, 2010) as they inform managing cognitive

load in various pedagogical activities. In all of my teaching and educational activities, I promote the integration of theory, practice, evidence and critical thinking.

3. CREATIVE PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

My creative professional activities contributions are the areas of *Professional Innovation and Creative Excellence* and *Development of Professional Practices*. The first includes knowledge translation activities designed to advance best practice in the area of neuro-cognitive rehabilitation. Contributions in the second are focus on advancing pedagogical and curriculum renewal in occupational therapy across Canada.
